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# **RCS at a glance**



#### What do we mean by it

Innovative solutions are often non-standard, do not comply with labelling or certification requirements, and sometimes also stay outside the provisions of extant legislation and regulations.

#### When is it important to use it

Focusing on RCS facilitates the diffusion of fully compliant products and services, thus helping to broader the market and make commercialisation prospects more sustainable. Interest in legislation and regulation is an obvious rule of behaviour for any public procurer.

#### Why it is important

Bearing this peculiar aspect in mind, procurers should make the best efforts (if justified by the interests at stake and the domain at hand) to reconcile tender outputs with RCS.

#### **How** it can be implemented

Standard setting bodies and labelling/certification organisms exist aplenty in all relevant domains. Whenever innovation promises to be radical, they can be contacted directly rather than only through reading their publications and then adopting their principles.

### Strengths
